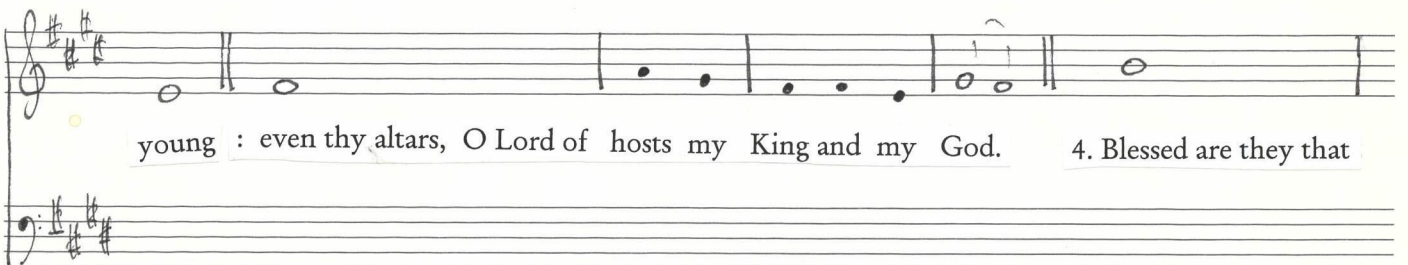
1. O how amiable are thy dwellings : thou Lord of hosts! 2. My soul hath a desire



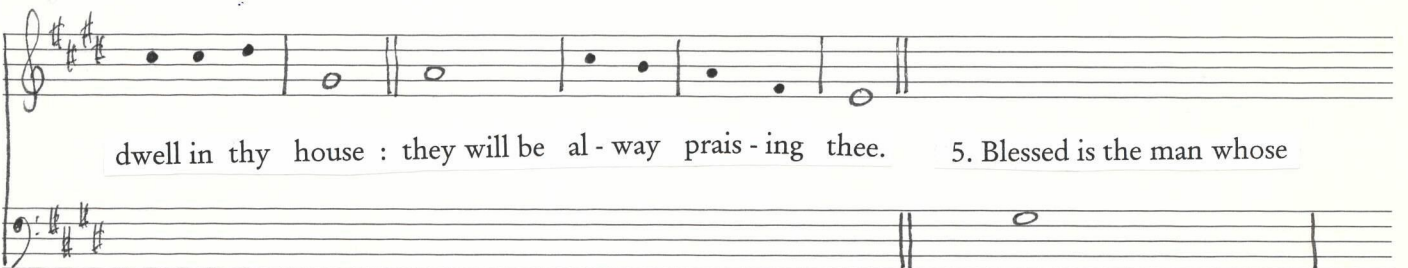
and longing, to enter into the courts of the Lord : my heart and my flesh re-joice in the li-ving



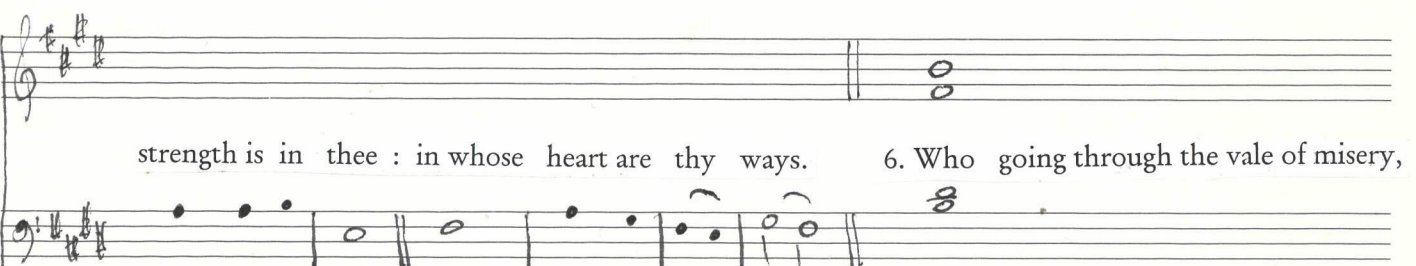
God. 3. Yea the sparrow hath found her an house, and the swallow a nest where she may lay her
